MHCO seeks to build on the successes of 2019.

Many positive developments occurred in 2019, including HDR Foundation's grant to replace the farm road bridge and SECU awarding MHCO a grant to include a comprehensive Organizational Assessment. The Licensing Review was extremely positive. The children achieved at extraordinary levels as the promotion rate was 98% and the graduation rate was 100%.

The new pool was dedicated and opened in May. GM Hallman's dedication featured benefits of a pool shared by Nettie Bemis in 1922 including improved health, confidence, and selfesteem. The pool is symbolic of the travels we have in life, more especially the children in care. Many children have not had the



experience of being in a pool or been taught how to swim. For them the pool is a significant challenge, just like living away from home. But the colorful slides, cascading mushroom, delightful bubblers, and playful laughter helps them overcome their trepidation,

just as the loving care, access to basic needs, medical attention, and school supports helps them overcome the adversity they are experiencing in their lives. I am amazed how the children progress in their swimming skills. I am more impressed in the progress they make

MHCO seeks to build on the successes of 2019, incorporating recommendations from the Organizational Assessment, continuing to build program and capital from grant awards, and implement a Trauma-Informed Model of Care to help the staff and children better navigate the turbulent waters of life. 


Eligible residents employed off-campus (monthly avg.)


